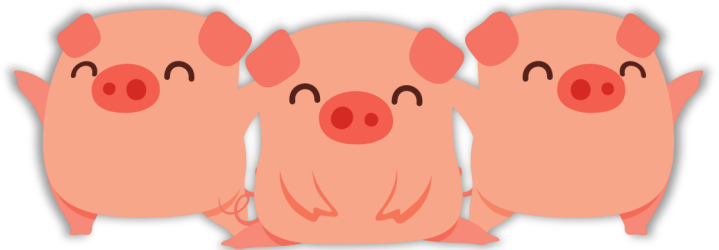
“The Three Little Pigs”

How long did it take each pig to build their house?

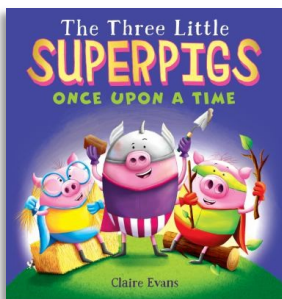
What elements of the story were repeated? Did these repeated elements make the story easier to remember?
